



Constance "Connie" Campbell

April 1, 1936 - December 9, 2014

Constance S. "Connie" Campbell, 78, of rural Wapakoneta, died 9:18 p.m., Tues. Dec. 9, 2014, at Lima Memorial Health System, with her family at her side. She was born April 1, 1936, in St. Johns, OH, the daughter of Clarence T. & Pauline (Basil) Miller, who preceded her in death. On July 17, 1955, she married Roland R. Campbell. He preceded her in death on Aug. 4, 1955, after just 18 days of marriage. Survivors include, a son, R. Rodney Campbell, Wapakoneta, 2 grandchildren, Ryan R. (Angela) Campbell & Heather D. (Michael J.) Selby, both of Wapakoneta; 2 great grandchildren, Alyssa & Mya Selby; and a brother-in-law, Dick Knoch, Wapakoneta. She was preceded in death by a daughter-in-law, Jeanne A. Campbell, and a sister, Joyce Knoch. Connie retired from Wapakoneta City Schools as an elementary teacher, after 35 years service. She had also worked at the Producers Livestock Assn., Wapakoneta, and the St. Johns Elevator. A 1954 graduate of Blume High School, and she was a 1965 graduate of the Ohio Northern University. She was the first woman volunteer fire fighter in Auglaize Co. with St. Johns Fire & Rescue, and also worked as an E.M.T. She served as president of the St. Johns Fire & Rescue Auxiliary, and volunteered as librarian at the Wapakoneta City Schools for 25 years. Connie was a life member of the Ohio & National Education Associations, and the Wapakoneta Education Assn. She served on the M.R.D.D. Board of Directors, New Bremen, OH. She was an amazing mom, grandma, and great grandma. She was devoted to her family, always available to help at a moment's notice. She was truly missed by her

family and friends. Funeral services will be 11:00 a.m., Sat. Dec. 13, 2014, at the Bayliff & Eley Funeral Home & Cremation Services, St. Rt. 501, Wapakoneta.
