In 1987, Dave was commissioned to the officer candidate program and stationed on the USS Arkansas, a Virginia class nuclear propelled guided missile cruiser. This is where Dave excelled and was instrumental in the Tomahawk missile program, advancing to Lieutenant Commander and stationed at the MacDonald Douglas plant as the Naval liaison for the Tomahawk program. During the final years of Dave's naval career, he was in command of the Naval Magazine on Guam, the Naval Weapons Station in Fallbrook, CA and the Naval Weapons Station in Earle, NJ.

Dave Nagel was a sailor, a soldier, and a patriot but most of all a friend to many. Dave enjoyed scuba diving, hunting, fishing, Harley Davidson's, and traveling around the globe from Ohio to Singapore to Guam back to Canada. He was a man of many lives and impacted many people.
