Evelyn J. King, 96, of Wapakoneta passed away peacefully on Friday, January 18, 2019 in her home.

She was born October 29, 1922 in Shelby County to Henry and Erma (Koons) Arnold, who preceded her in death. She grew up on a farm west of Botkins and graduated from Botkins High School in 1940.

Evelyn's first job after graduation was manager at Vondie's Gas Station and Restaurant. She met Harold King there after he returned from WWII and they were married March 4, 1946, he preceded her in death on August 4, 2002.

They moved to Wapakoneta to work and raise a family. During her life Evelyn worked at the Teddy Bear Restaurant, the Hub Room at the Truck Stop and Meinerding's. She was a cook and waitress earning the nickname "Cookie"
