Marlene Ann Wildermuth passed away on Monday, December 15, 2025. She was born on August 1, 1936, the third of six daughters to William and Luetta Miller, of Cridersville. She graduated from Cridersville H.S. in 1954. On September 11, 1960, Marlene married Ermine E. Wildermuth. They settled in Wapakoneta and raised three children on the family farm, on Hardin Pike. Marlene is survived by her husband of 65 years and their children -- Paul (Jane) Wildermuth, of Botkins; Brian (Jane) Wildermuth, of Miamisburg; and Julie (Mike) Carlson, of Anna.
