Myrtle DeLong, 103, of Wapakoneta, died at 11:15a.m. Sat. June 9, 2012 at her son's residence near Wapakoneta. She was born September 30, 1908 to Jessie and Millie Shaw, who preceded her in death. On May 2, 1931, she married Harley DeLong, who died Oct. 9, 1983. Mrs. DeLong was a member of the first graduation class of Cridersville High School. She was the head cook at Northridge Elementary until she retired in 1969. She also worked on the farm along with her husband. She was a member of Salem United Methodist Church, Wapakoneta, where she taught Sunday school for many years. Myrtle and her husband Harley also owned and operated DeLong's Lunch, a mobile lunch stand that catered to many auctions (mainly Eugene Myers Auction Service). They were well known for serving their special BBQ, chicken sandwiches and delicious pies. She was also preceded in death by a son, James DeLong, a daughter MaryBeth Carpenter, a son Donald DeLong, a granddaughter Nancy McClintock, a daughter-in-law Elaine DeLong, and a great-grandson Alex DeLong.
