Ned F. Coon, 80, of Wapakoneta, died 3:18 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 8, 2012, at Lima Memorial Health System, surrounded by his family, following a brief illness. He was born Nov. 9, 1931, on his grandparents' farm, near Buckland, OH, the son of Harley & Eva (Ramga) Coon, who preceded him in death. Survivors include, three children, Patricia Werst, Wapakoneta, Tim (Pam) Coon, Wapakoneta, Matthew (Amy) Coon, of McCordsville, IN; a grandson, Allen Thorpe, of Cincinnati, OH; a great grandson, Jacob Thorpe, Cincinnati.
