Robert C. "Bob" Schaub, 92, of Wapakoneta, died 8:06 a.m., Fri. Oct. 15, 2010, at Otterbein-St. Marys. He was born March 13, 1918, in Wapakoneta, in the home he has lived in, the son of Fred & Lura (Fisher) Schaub, who preceded him in death. On June 7, 1941, he married Dorothea "Dot" Fett, and she died March 14, 2009.
