Senior Airman Kevin A. Bittinger, 24, of Wapakoneta, died Mon. May 4, 2015, in South Korea, while stationed there with the U.S. Air Force. He was born Sept. 24, 1990, in St. Marys, OH, the son of Thomas D. & Cindy R. (Jaeger) Bittinger, who survive in Wapakoneta.
